Past Trespass Damages and Annual Access Permits

Dear Matt.

On behalf of the Lac du Flambeau Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians (the "Tribe"), I'm writing to communicate a few things to you and the Town of Lac du Flambeau ("Town"). First, the Tribe has enacted a Road Access Permitting Ordinance ("Permitting Ordinance"), a copy of which is enclosed, that applies to all roads traversing lands owned by the Tribe, or by the United States as a trustee for the Tribe ("Access Roads"). As you will see, the Permitting Ordinance will allow legal access to those roads, in exchange for a fee equal to 1.5% of the state-assessed fair market value for the homes situated along the Access Road.

Second, the Town will not be eligible to utilize the forward-looking Permitting Ordinance until the issues related to the past trespass over Annie Sunn Lane, Center Sugarbush Lane, East Ross Allen Lake Lane, and Elsie Lake Lane (the "Four Roads"), along with past trespass over Big Thunder Lane, are resolved. The Tribe has calculated these past trespass damages to be:

\$2,885,370	10-year Settlement (1.5% applied to Four Roads)
\$3,448,843	Big Thunder Settlement (1.5% applied to East Ross for 31 years)
\$140,000	Legal Fees related to negotiations
\$183,507	Pollard v. Johnson Legal Fees
\$3,000,000	Tribal Administration Fees

\$9,657,720

**Past Damages** 

The Tribe will not issue any permits under the Permitting Ordinance to the Town until the Tribe receives payment for the past trespass damages.

Finally, as the Tribe has communicated to you and the Town repeatedly in the past, the Tribe will not approve any new long-term easements over Access Roads.
